## Lou to preach at St. Peter's in Rome!

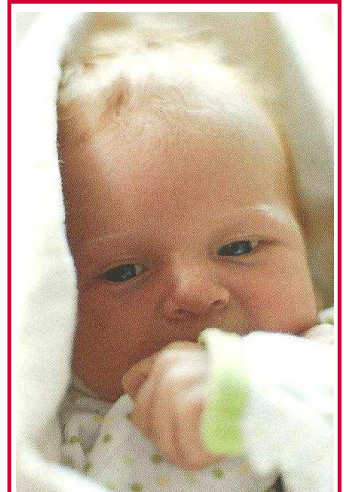

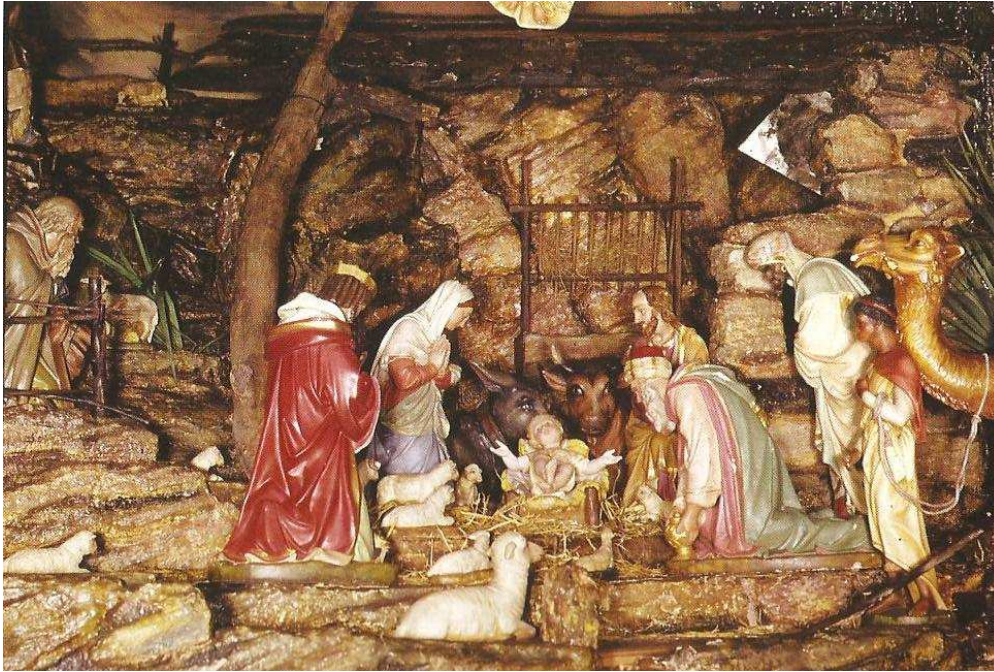
